

# IMPACT STATEMENT – 2018

PATH's mission is to end homelessness for individuals, families, and communities.

## PATH's Work

Since its founding in 1984, PATH has pioneered bold and effective approaches to assist people experiencing homelessness. PATH operates services throughout California, connecting clients to a comprehensive continuum of homelessness prevention, street outreach, employment preparation and placement assistance, individualized case management, supportive services, interim housing, and permanent supportive housing. Our real estate arm, PATH Ventures, was created in 2007 and has more than 1,250 units of permanent supportive housing built and in development.

## PATH ends homelessness and builds communities in 3 ways:

### 1. SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

Strategic street outreach, assertive community treatment, system navigation, employment assistance, housing placement, and housing retention.

### 2. HOUSING

#### Interim Housing

Low-barrier, harm reduction, and recuperative care.

#### Permanent Housing

Site-based supportive housing and rapid re-housing.

### 3. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community mobilization, customized community solutions, and partnerships.

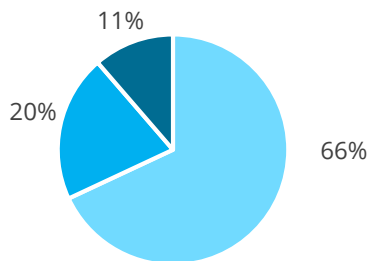

## PATH's 2018 Highlights

### Los Angeles

- Moved 64 tenants into PATH Metro Villas, Ho Family Building. PATH Metro Villas Phase 2 is currently under construction and one of the first supportive housing communities to break ground using Proposition HHH funds.
- Partnered with the YWCA to open a 64-bed emergency shelter for women experiencing homelessness in Hollywood.
- Launched LeaseUp LA, a countywide housing location program that includes the collaboration of CES agencies, landlords, and housing partners across LA County.
- Expanded our contract with the LA County Department of Health Services and the Los Angeles Metropolitan Transit Authority to provide multi-disciplinary (i.e., mental health, substance abuse, medical) outreach support for people experiencing homelessness on Metro train and bus lines, day and night.

### San Diego

- Celebrated our five-year anniversary.
- Began the Whole Person Wellness (WPW) program to serve high utilizers of health services. WPW demonstrates the critical need for collaboration between the healthcare system and homeless services. We engage the hardest to reach individuals experiencing homelessness.
- Started a street outreach pilot with the Business Improvement Districts in North Park and City Heights.

### Santa Barbara

- Launched an innovative recuperative care program in partnership with Cottage Health, serving high-need homeless patients discharged from the hospital.
- Awarded Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) funds to operate LeaseUp Santa Barbara—a countywide landlord engagement program.

### San Jose

- Broke ground on Villas on the Park, one of San Jose's first 100% permanent supportive housing developments. Villas will offer 83 units of supportive housing and on-site services.
- Expanded our Rapid Re-housing program, helping 30 individuals transition off the streets and into permanent homes.
- Expanded our street outreach contracts to serve individuals experiencing homelessness throughout the City of San Jose.
- Since 2015, our street outreach teams have served more than 800 people, and help one client per week transition
