



PATH's mission is to end homelessness for individuals, families, and communities. We do this by building affordable housing and providing supportive services throughout California.

PATH ORANGE COUNTY'S STORY PATH began operations in Orange County in March 2020 with the 100-bed Placentia Navigation Center. In January 2021, we opened the 425-bed Yale Navigation Center in partnership with the County of Orange. In 2022, we enhanced Outreach and Care Coordination programs, and in 2023, we partnered with CalOptima Health for Community Supports and Enhanced Care Management services. In 2024, PATH expanded outreach to Newport Beach, intensified Day Habilitation programming, and launched new Encampment Resolution initiatives in Garden Grove.

KEY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Yale Navigation Center (YNC)

This site is a referral-only, 425-bed interim housing site serving individuals and couples experiencing homelessness. Wraparound services, including case management, housing navigation, healthcare, and employment services, are available to all residents, along with meals, laundry facilities, and transportation to and from the site.

Outreach and Engagement

Outreach staff engage and build trusting relationships with unsheltered individuals to help enroll them into stabilizing services. Our staff conduct assessments, identify needs and challenges, and make referrals to services that help people move off the streets and into housing. In 2024, outreach services expanded to the City of Newport Beach.

Encampment Resolution

PATH employs compassionate strategies for encampment resolution, focusing on proactive outreach and connecting individuals experiencing homelessness to housing solutions and supportive services. Our Encampment Resolution Fund (ERF) has effectively served the City of Costa Mesa. In 2024, we partnered with the City of Garden Grove to expand our services to additional geographic regions.

PATH Orange County

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Health Services

PATH Orange County is a CalOptima Health provider and delivers services to individuals experiencing or at risk of homelessness through our Community Supports (CS) and Enhanced Care Management (ECM) programs. CS assists eligible participants with housing navigation and tenancy support, while ECM coordinates care for Medi-Cal populations with complex needs. Our Day Habilitation program develops adaptive living skills through a modular curriculum, offered both individually and in groups.

Care Coordination

The Care Coordination Program links unsheltered adults to interim and permanent housing and supportive services, ensuring continuity of care from the streets to stable placements. PATH partners with the county's Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) to expedite resources for high-utilizers of county services, including jail in-reach and re-entry planning.

Rapid Re-Housing, Housing Navigation, and Retention

Our Rapid Re-Housing program assists individuals experiencing homelessness in securing permanent, affordable housing. Our housing specialists help identify needs, address barriers, and facilitate quick connections to sustainable options. We provide support for unit searches, move-in processes, and cover costs like furniture and rental subsidies. Our services also include landlord liaison support and financial assistance. With a holistic approach, we offer comprehensive case management to promote stability, skill development, and resource access, helping individuals thrive and prevent future homelessness.

Pet-Friendly Services

PATH Orange County welcomes service and emotional support animals, recognizing that pets provide vital support for many of our participants. We partner with the Humane Society to provide access to food and veterinary services, including mobile pet clinics.
